TRADE WATCH**DHS Secy & Mexican Counterpart Sign Border, Aviation Security Arrangements**

On March 23, 2010, DHS Secretary Napolitano joined with Mexican Interior Secretary Gómez-Mont to sign two arrangements to bolster aviation and border security between the United States and Mexico at the Mérida U.S.-Mexico High Level Consultative Group meeting further expanding ongoing cooperative efforts to crack down on violent drug cartels and combat terrorism while facilitating the secure and efficient flow of legitimate travel and trade.

DDTC Updates List of Statutorily Debarred Parties Through March 2010

The DDTC announces that the Arms Export Control Act list of Statutorily Debarred Parties has been updated for the period of July 1988 through March 2010. The list includes the Federal Register cite for each debarred party.

CBSA Amends D-Memorandum on NAFTA Specific Origin Rules

The CBSA has amended its Memorandum D11-5-2 NAFTA - Specific Rules of Origin. The amendments reflect the liberalization of the rules of origin for herbs and spices, petroleum, leather, certain textiles and apparel, aluminum, diesel engines, gas turbines and parts, valves, electric transformers, primary cells and batteries, telephonics, televisions, locomotives and parts, medical appliances and parts, and other instruments.

1. This is an update to add Import Prohibition on poultry and poultry products originating in the Baja California and Distrito Federal areas of Mexico (MX) under the Domestic Animal Infectious Disease Control Law. The following HTS chapters are affected: 01, 02 and 16.
2. This is an update to add Import Prohibition on poultry and poultry products originating in South Korea (KR) under the Domestic Animal Infectious Disease Control Law. The following HTS chapters are affected: 01, 02 and 16.

Authority: Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries

INDIA

1. This is an update to India Export Regulations, to capture export license requirements imposed on cotton yarn. The following HTS chapter is affected: 52.
2. This is an update to Import Regulations for India. This update imposes Import License requirements for worn clothing and worn articles. The following HTS chapter is affected: 63.
3. This is an update to Import Regulations for India. This update recalls the Import License requirement imposed on radial tyres.

MIDDLE-EAST/AFRICA**UNITED ARAB EMIRATES**

This is an update for UAE Export Control Regulations. The products affected by this prohibition are sheep and Fish. The following HTS chapters are affected: 01 and 03.

TRADE WATCH contd...**WTO Expects Global Trade to Grow 9.5% in 2010**

According to the World Trade Organization, global trade is set to rebound in 2010 by growing at 9.5%. Exports from developed economies are expected to increase by 7.5%, while shipments from the rest of the world should rise by around 11%. This strong expansion will help recover some but not all of the ground lost in 2009 when global trade contracted 12.2%.

AAFA Submits Comments Supporting Trans-Pacific Partnership FTA

The American Apparel and Footwear Association has submitted comments to the International Trade Commission regarding the proposed Trans-Pacific Partnership Free Trade Agreement. In its comments, AAFA expressed support for the negotiation of this FTA because it believes the FTA will have a positive impact on its industry and on the U.S.

OECD Members Praise Turkey for Anti-Bribery Efforts

The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development states that Turkey has made significant progress in its efforts to combat bribery in international business deals by fully implementing all but one of the recommendations made by the OECD Working Group on Bribery in 2007, earning praise during a recent meeting of other members of the OECD Anti-Bribery Convention.

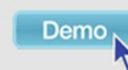
